Request under The Freedom Of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request dated 7 October, in which you requested the following:

- 1. The number of companies who successfully applied to the Events Industry Support Fund
- 2. The amount of each award to those companies
- 3. The name of each company that was supported by the Event Industry Support Fund

I have considered your request, and can respond as follows:

At this time the information you have asked for at point 1 and pont 3 of your request is not yet available. This is because applications to the fund are still being assessed.

Regarding your request at point 2, I can confirm that the amount to be made available to each successful applicant is £10,000, as stated in the guidance for the fund.

I have provided a link to the guidance and in there you will also read that information on all grant awards will be published on the European Commission Competition database when available.

If you wish to request a review of your application under either the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 or the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004, your request should be submitted to us in writing, or another permanent format (for example e-mail or voice recording), and be received by us within 40 days of the date of this letter. Any request for a review should also set out, in as much detail as possible, the reasons why you are not satisfied with our

response or the manner in which we have dealt with your application.

If you are still not satisfied with our handling of your application after we have responded to your request for a review, you have a right to apply to the Scottish Information Commissioner for a decision on whether we have dealt with your request in accordance with the Act.
